

THE ROYAL EMBLEM IN COMMEMORATION OF THE GRAND CELEBRATION

The Royal Emblem specially created to mark the 50th Anniversary of H.M. the King's Accession to the Throne Grand Celebration is a montage of various images neatly presented in a classic design. The images represent certain articles and symbols of sovereignty including:

The Royal Private Seal of His Majesty the King as the centre piece with the High Symbol of Chakri Dynasty and Maha Bhichai Mongkut, literally the Great Crown of Victory, on top. The design purposefully signifies His Majesty's personal status as one of the great rulers in the reigning Chakri Dynasty. The two images of white elephants in an attentive posture beneath a white nine-tier royal umbrella on each side and facing each other to keep the Seal in position with a double-deck golden footed tray in the middle bring a variety of meanings to the Emblem.

First, the elephants in their traditional role in the past as a means of transport for Thai kings, are regarded as the symbol of good service and a deep sense of loyalty. With such belief, the symbolic elephants seem to reiterate that all Thai citizens have the duty to be of good service to the Throne and the Chakri Dynasty and always wholeheartedly pay His Majesty supreme respect while enjoying a peaceful and happy life under the royal protection as symbolised by the nine-tier royal umbrellas.

Second, because white elephants were traditionally treated as creatures of importance. According to Brahmanism, any white elephant, if captured and found bearing correct characteristics as described in ancient scriptures, could be regarded as befalling good omens for the reigning monarch resulting in the rise of his sovereign power and courage, the increasing of his wisdom and the surge of his porsonal glory and intellect.

Third, elephants have long been historically associated with the Thai Kingdom in many ways. The image of a white elephant was once adorned the Thai national flag. With a life span longer than other animals, elephants were deemed a symbol of longevity, a perfect match with Thailand as a nation long in history.

There were also other reasons for depicting elephant images in the Royal Emblem. As one of the animals high on the list of endangered species and seriously needing protection, the elephant images on the Emblem may help stir up the stronger sense of conservation and love for this gentle and clever animal. But if the elephant's path to extinction cannot be avoided in the time to come, the images may somehow help the future generations in their learning of this majestic animal.
