ABOUT THIS BOOK

What used to be called, in the mid-fifties, the Soviet penetration into the Middle East has become, by the early seventies, a strong presence in the region and a deep involvement in its affairs. Yet the boundaries of the extension of Soviet influence in this area have not yet crystallized and the Soviet posture still fluctuates between new gains and sudden setbacks. An international conference, convened at Tel Aviv University in December 1971, attempted to evaluate the extent of the Soviet deployment in the Middle East, the interests which motivate it, the dilemmas it is facing, and its impact on local countries. This volume presents most of the papers read at that conference, as revised in the light of the conference's deliberations and later developments.
