It is an upto-date survey of the Muslim minorities of the world, giving details of the advent and growth of Islam in those countries, the composition and areas of concentration of the Muslim population, the number and condition of mosques, state of religious and secular education of the Muslims and their economic condition. The status of religious freedom enjoyed by the Muslim community and its socio-cultural relations with the members of the majority community are portrayed, concluding with enunciation of the major problems faced by the Muslim community.

Numerous tables, appendices, maps and an index provide easy information to the reader about the Muslim minorities.

It has taken the author seven years to collect and analyse the data and information contained in this book. These were collected from various sources including books, journals, scholars and organisations and from many Muslim leaders of the minority communities and then duly vetted and verified for authenticity.

For those interested in the study of the problems facing the Muslim Ummah, particularly the Muslim minorities, many of whom are now passing through traumatic experience, the book is of considerable value.
